Doug Yeomans, Guitarist

Doug Yeomans is an acoustic and electric guitarist, a vocalist, songwriter, performer, teaching artist and clinician. Yeomans actively writes, records and performs original American roots music. In June 2001, he won the North American Rock Guitar Competition sponsored by the Buffalo Niagara Guitar Festival.

His clinician experience includes yearly workshops at the Mayville Bluegrass Festival; Wellsville Creative Arts Center, Wellsville, NY; Guitar Summit, Jordan Ont.; Melodee Music, Leesburg, VA; and facilitator of a popular Bluegrass Guitar Club.

Yeomans has been a contracted clinician with Young Audiences of Western New York since 2001, each year sharing his talents and knowledge with thousands of elementary to high school children.

Yeomans formally studied guitar with Buffalo, NY guitarists Andy Romer and Frank Gerard. He's studied informally through sharing stages with Muddy Waters, Levon Helm, Buffalo pianist Stan Szelest, Paul Butterfield, Bill Monroe, Del McCoury, Vassar Clemens, Clay Hess, and more, learning the essence of roots music from the masters. He was chosen twice as a featured performer on the University of Buffalo series: Music is Art Live.

Among his music-related performances, Yeomans was the lead guitarist for the 2007-08 national tour of the Broadway show about Johnny Cash, "Ring Of Fire," and guitarist for the Broadway production of "It Ain' t Nothin' But The Blues."
